Our checklist may assist to help you identify what you would like to bring for your guided hunt.

This checklist is provided for convenience only; clients are solely responsible for selecting, maintaining, and ensuring the safety and suitability of all items they choose to bring.

Weapons and Optics

- ☐ Rifle or Shotgun:
 - function as intended by the original manufacturer
 - Meet hunting regulations (ARS R12-4-303 A)
 - Ammunition must fit firearms you bring
 - optics of your choice, zeroed before arrival

We do not loan/rent firearms.

License and Legal

- ☐ Valid ID **(Required)**
- ☐ Hunting License **(Required)**
- ☐ Hunt-permit tags
 - non-permit tag for bear
 - non-permit tag for mountain lion

*We need these in-person for AZGFD reporting
We cannot hunt if you forget them. (ARS R12-4-208 R)*

Hunting Accessories

- ☐ Shooting Sticks, tripod, or tall bipods
 - 30 to 40"+ height
 - we do not recommend shooting freehand
- ☐ Binoculars and Range Finder
 - chest harness
- ☐ Drag ropes
- ☐ Seating (stools or pads)

*Bring what you are comfortable carrying
We do not bring spare accessories.*

Clothing

- ☐ Hiking boots or shoes:
 - sturdy, over-the-ankle boots with proper tread and support.
- ☐ Layered and appropriate clothing:
 - camo or neutral/earth tones are ok
- ☐ Facemask
- ☐ Gloves
- ☐ Hat

*Temperatures and conditions can vary.
Guests are responsible for selecting
and wearing appropriate clothes and footwear
for rugged, uneven terrain.*

Food, Water & Essentials

- ☐ **Alcoholic beverages are not allowed**
- ☐ Snacks
- ☐ Sunscreen (non-scented)
- ☐ Toiletries
- ☐ Hygiene products
- ☐ Cellphone
- ☐ Vehicle-based cellphone charger

NOTES:

- Ensure all weapons are properly zeroed, target shooting is not allowed.
